Don and Brandee Sisting
took a trip to Baja Sur

Laguna ojo de liebre to


see the migration of the gray whales. It was a two-day trip traveling from Camarillo to Guerrero Negro. We camped along the way in San Felipe and then spent 4 days in Guerrero Negro. The scenery along the way was very interesting, but the highlight of the trip was the two days we went out on a panga with Shari Bondy, a marine biologist for 30 years and owner of Whale Magic tours to see the gray whales.

We were able to take lots of pictures, touch the gray whales (actually they would touch us as we hung over the side of the boat), and some of the people on the panga even kissed the gray whales. The whales were very friendly. They are beautiful intelligent curious mammals. Don took lots of pictures on the panga.

We invite you to attend our presentation on Wednesday, 8.20.2025 to hear more about our "Gray Whale Encounters". We will show our pictures and cover the history of migration and information about the gray whales. Maybe even put together another trip this February!

Lake Superior the Emperor





Emperor 525 ft long steel bulk freighter sank in 1947 it has a narrow swim thru under the keel at 160'

July 12-17 diving wrecks around Isle Royale in Lake Superior. The wrecks varied in depth from 40ft to 165ft. Surface

temperatures were in the high 40's and at depths of 38 feet. These wrecks

have been down in many cases over 100 years; with the cold fresh water they are very well preserved. Below the thermocline at about 70ft the visibility is amazing 100+ feet. The wrecks we dove hit either one of the many rocky shoals or in the case of the America run into the island and sank with the bow in 4ft and the stern at 85ft.







PHOTO CONTEST

Calling all underwater photographers and videographers! Submit your best stuff taken since last November to our 2025 photo contest. The rules and our NEW online entry form are at <u>channelislandsdivers.org</u>. The contest closes at the October meeting, 10/22, and winners will be announced at the Christmas party.



2025 Rules for Entry

The 2025 Photo & Video Contest is open to all **CID members in good standing**. i.e., your membership is <u>paid</u> and current when you enter <u>and</u> when awards are given. Anonymous entries will be evaluated by an independent, non-club member judge appointed by the CID Board.

Photos and videos will be evaluated on the following criteria:

THEME – How well the photo/video relates to scuba diving

TECHNICAL MERIT – Quality of composition, lighting, contrast, focus, etc.

ARTISTIC MERIT - Visual interest, emotional connection, etc.

Prizes for First and Second place will be awarded for each category. Each member may submit only TWO entries per category. However, each member will be limited to one prize per category. In the event the judge selects two entries by the same person as the winners for a category, a runner-up will be chosen by the judge for the second-place prize.

CATEGORIES

Underwater Macro Photo – Macro shots are more than a close-up (often cropped from a wide-angle shot) – in true macro, the magnification ratio is 1:1 or higher, and the size of the subject on the image sensor is life-size or greater.

Underwater Wide-Angle Photo - (includes close focus wide-angle and wide-angle pictures) Close focus wide-angle combines a foreground macro subject with wide-angle background showing the subject's surroundings. Wide angle is with a lens that has a focal length of less than 35mm.

Topside Photo – The subject of the photo must be related to diving (not just the beach).

Underwater Video – The total length of each submission must not exceed 60 seconds and must be a single, unedited clip. No special effects or titles may be added.

Novice – If you have not previously won in our photo contest, you may enter two photos or videos in this category, as well as in the other categories.

DEADLINE:

Go to the Photo Contest page and follow the step-by-step instructions there to submit your entry.

Or, submit all photo and video entries along with an entry form to the Club President by the club's General Meeting, **October 15, 2025**. Bring your form and a drive/SD card (marked with your name) to the meeting.

Dive Report - Channel Islands Divers

Date and Time: June 22, 2025, 8:00 AM

Location: Kayak Dive **Weather Conditions**: Sunny

Surf Conditions: 1-foot waves, Water Temp: 65°F

On Saturday, July 19th, 5 club members were treated to the calm waters of Carpinteria Reef. Mark Thompson, Rob Marion, and Rob Johnson dove off kayaks and Tony Frabasillio and Nicholas Lee shore dove.

The kelp in this area is so thick that a kayak is the perfect platform to dive from. Paddling over the thick surface

mat of kelp makes it easy to get to where you want to dive. Shore diving requires more work, but the rewards are still the same. All divers reported seeing a lot of lobster, a leopard shark, swell sharks, horn sharks, and many varieties of fish. Visibility was quite good considering how shallow our dives were.


We headed to Sandiego to dive the Yukon, the Rubie E, la Jolla



shores and also ventured to the USS midway.




