
Now we have normal back. Now things are beginning to take shape the way it should be. The way we are used to.

Once again, the *Spectre* is offering a great discount to club members. However, you may notice the club price is almost \$10 more than our previous trips. Well, yes, the general price has gone up from \$185 to \$195, plus credit card fees, which brings the final price to around \$200 for the public! Along with the general price increase, the price charged to the club has also gone up. However, In the club's case, the *Spectre* does not pass along any credit card fees to us, so the overall saving per each club member is approximately \$35 to \$40. That savings more than covers your club renewal fee for the year!




This adult female gator, Bertha, is responsible for raising several generations of alligators in the Everglades!!

Day 6: Was a full day of diving, with marine conditions still being quite rough, but beautiful weather on land. Most of the group headed out for the morning dives back at Elbow Reef. The afternoon dive was an **advanced dive only**, to the wreck of the *USS Spiegel Grove*, which is located 6 miles off the coast of Key Largo and sits at a depth of 60 to 140 ft.



Day 7: Our last full day in Key Largo, and we headed out at 7:30am to Miami for an airboat tour of about 20 miles of the approximately 572,00 acres of sawgrass marshes of the Everglades. Our guides for this great tour were Everglades of Grass Ecotours.




